Why Most Recyclers Cannot Take Obsolete Vapes

1. The Dual Problem Inside Modern Vapes

Most obsolete vapes contain two things that standard recycling and waste streams refuse to accept together:

- Lithium-ion batteries — fire risk, special handling rules, and restrictions on how they can be shipped and processed.
- Nicotine residue — treated as a regulated material that many facilities will not accept without proper documentation and process controls.

2. Why Leaving It in Storage Creates Risk
